  - AN INTRODUCTION OF YOURSELF (THE CHARACTER) TO THE AUDIENCE
  - O ANY MAJOR CHRONOLOGICAL EVENTS OF THE STORY IN WHICH YOUR CHARACTER IS INVOLVED
  - O YOUR CHARACTER'S CONTRIBUTION TO THE STORY/WHY YOUR CHARACTER IS IMPORTANT TO THE STORY
- YOU WILL NEED TO BRING ONE PROP THAT THE CHARACTER WOULD HAVE USED.
  - THIS NEEDS TO BE RELATED TO THE CHARACTER OR WHAT HE OR SHE ACCOMPLISHES WITHIN THE STORY
  - O BE CREATIVE!
- YOU WILL PRESENT THIS REPORT AS A PUBLIC SPEAKING GRADE.
  - O YOU WILL NOT BE EXPECTED TO READ YOUR REPORT VERBATIM. YOU MUST DELIVER YOUR SPEECH FROM MEMORY (THE USE OF NOTECARDS WITH KEY POINTS WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR USE DURING YOUR SPEECH)
  - O YOU WILL BE EXPECTED TO FOLLOW THE PUBLIC SPEAKING RUBRIC FOR THIS PORTION (ATTACHED)
  - YOU WILL BE EXPECTED TO VERBALLY EXPLAIN YOUR PROP! (THIS DOES NOT NEED TO BE INCLUDED IN YOUR WRITTEN MONOLOGUE, BUT IT MUST BE PRESENT ON YOUR NOTE CARDS SHOULD YOU CHOOSE TO USE THEM)
